The more I learn about anything, the more I realize that there is yet a great deal more to be learned.

But the law of diminishing returns forewarns that even the pursuit of learning --- and especially as the field of learning narrows --- needs tempering.

.. else one may come to the point where one gets to know more and more about less and less and reach the ridiculous state of knowing almost absolutely everything about a field of knowledge so small as to be almost nothing at all.

I wish I could claim that the foregoing as my own, but, alas it is not. I do not know who originally authored the concept, but I am satisfied to restate it here in words of my own choosing.
